




Fall NWEA Baseline Scores English Language Arts (ELA)






Fall NWEA Baseline Scores Mathematics






Fall NWEA Baseline Scores Science

ELA Reading Goals for 2nd Quarter

- Increase focus on 7 key comprehension strategies particularly at 4th & 5th grade
- Include explicit Interactive Read Aloud daily with modeling of comprehension strategies
- Continue PD on Understanding Reading Data to increase focus on QRI comprehension analysis
- K 2nd Explicit Phonics / Phonemic Awareness Lessons 15 min./daily





NWEA: Math & Science

Math Goals for 2nd Quarter

- Using the daily spiral review to close the gaps
- Using number talks for academic vocabulary and number sense
- Modeling and using manipulatives to make sure students have concrete concepts before procedural knowledge

Science Goals for 2nd Quarter

- Continue to work with K-2 teachers to increase phenomena
- Continue to provide PD, job-embedded, observations, and feedbacks

- Increase academic vocabulary
- Access more rigorous text

Algebra I

- Continue to analyze pre and post test

Focus & Priority Site Visits

- Focused on a Problem of Practice:

 - Directly Observable
 - Actionable (and can be improved in real time)
 - Connects to a Broader Strategy (School Improvement Plan)
 - High-leverage (will make a significant difference for student learning)



Attendance PLC Support

- Review and share Tier I, II, and III interventions with fellow administrators.
- Jigsaw research articles that feature best practices around truancy and attendance.
- Administrators bring attendance notebooks and share how their attendance teams function and the results they are achieving.
- Look at data reports that school teams are using and address areas of concern they are still having.

Student Growth Objectives

- Two Student Growth Objectives using whole class data
 - SGO #1: Norm-Referenced Assessment/Standardized
 - Example: NWEA, Benchmark Assessments in Achievement Series
 - Teachers will use the Quadrant Report from NWEA
 - Fall to Winter
 - Met or Exceeded their Projected Growth
 - SGO #2: Formative Assessment approved by CIPD
 - Includes, but not limited to: STAR (3rd 10th grade; Grade Equivalent or Scale Score), Alpha Kids (K-2nd); Performance based test
 - These assessments will measure growth in our students



Student Growth Objectives (cont.)

- Curriculum, Instruction & Professional Development
 - Certified staff who do not administer the NWEA or CIPD assessments will work with principals and CIPD to write the assessment for their content area (Ex. Foreign Language, Military, Career and Technical, Counselors, Librarians, etc.)



Student Growth Objectives (cont.)

- Exclusion Criteria
 - Must have Pre/Post Test data
 - May be in attendance 90% of the time during the SGO
 - Student for whom you are not responsible for the direct instruction of the SGO content
 - Example: Exceptional Ed. pull out, ELL pull out
